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## **NAMING OF A NEW PRIVATE WAY OFF CEMETERY ROAD, EAST TAIERI, MOSGIEL**

Department: Transport

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### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- 1 This report seeks support from the Mosgiel-Taieri Community Board on the proposed naming of a private way off 22 Cemetery Road, East-Taieri, Mosgiel.
- 2 The new road names proposed by the developer are 'Jollie Lane' or 'Redwood Lane', but only 'Jollie Lane' complies with the DCC Road Naming Policy.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That the Board:

- a) **Supports** the naming of a new private way off 22 Cemetery Road, East-Taieri, Mosgiel as 'Jollie Lane'.

### **BACKGROUND**

- 3 The DCC Road Naming Policy provides the framework for timely and consistent naming of roads that reflect the identity of the local community. The DCC Road Naming Policy requires that Community Boards consider proposed names for roads in their area. For reference, the Road Naming Policy and Road Naming Procedure can be accessed on the DCC website at [www.dunedin.govt.nz/road-naming](http://www.dunedin.govt.nz/road-naming).
- 4 SUB 2020- 100-22 granted subdivision consent for the land located at 22 Cemetery Road, East Taieri, Mosgiel. (See Attachment A-Map). The developer has proposed 'Jollie Lane' or 'Redwood Lane' as potential names for the road providing access to the subdivision, noting that neither name was preferred over the other.

### **DISCUSSION**

- 5 'Redwood Lane' recognises a large tree which was planted nearby decades ago. However, an almost identical name (Redwoods Lane) was approved by the Infrastructure Services Committee for another private way off 14 Polwarth Road, Dunedin on 12/05/2020, which means that the proposed name does not comply with the Road Naming Policy. (Attachment B-Assessment of proposed road name for 'Redwood Lane').
- 6 'Jollie Lane' refers to Edward Jollie (1825-1894) who was a pioneer land surveyor in New Zealand, initially as a cadet surveyor with the New Zealand Company. (Attachment C-Assessment of proposed road name for 'Jollie Lane').

- 7 Between the two names proposed, ‘Jollie Lane’ is considered to meet the spelling and appropriateness criteria of the Road Naming Policy but ‘Redwood Lane’ does not.

**OPTIONSOption One – Recommended Option- The Board supports naming of the private way off 22 Cemetery Road, East-Taieri, Mosgiel, as ‘Jollie Lane’**

*Advantages*

- The road will be named, and landowners gain a street address allowing them to progress with building and access to services.

*Disadvantages*

- No disadvantages have been identified

**Option Two – Status Quo – The Board does not support naming the private way off 22 Cemetery Road, East-Taieri, Mosgiel, as ‘Jollie Lane’**

*Advantages*

- There are no significant advantages identified with this option.

*Disadvantages*

- The road will not have a name which will inconvenience new property owners within the development.

**NEXT STEPS**

- 8 If the proposed name of ‘Jollie Lane’ is supported by the Community Board, staff will request formal approval from the Infrastructure Services Committee.



**Bicycle Rack; Mob Scooter Security Stand.**

I sent a note to Brian Peat a while back on this matter but got no response.

The distance from Chatsford to the city bus route in Factory Rd or Gordon Rd is quite long particularly if one has a disability. It is 860 metres from my apartment; a 15 min walk.

The same matter would apply to Brooklands; the new upcoming village also needs to be taken into account.

I attach the loop bus and city bus timetables. The areas marked in a patch are where the loop bus and the city bus can be matched together with minimal waiting time but they are also minimal.


Where they are marked in a loop, both buses depart from the Factory Rd terminus within 1 minute of each other. If working across a diagonal to the bus stop opposite the Hotel Taieri, one would expect the loop bus and the city bus would cross each other at about the same time.

So you cannot guarantee catching the loop bus will get one there in time to cross the road for the city bus in such circumstance; nor on the way back from town is one guaranteed a loop bus without a 20 min wait.

For that reason I would ask the Board to consider placing a bicycle rack and a scooter security locking area at the bus stops either opposite Hotel Taieri or by Countdown. Anzac Park could also be considered.

To show the latest seen example for the need; a Chatsford resident had an outpatient appointment at Dunedin Hospital. Because of the timing she could not use the bus; she was being picked up; I am not sure whether privately or by taxi.

I am sorry to say that I was better off in Waimate using public transport to get to Oamaru or Timaru than I am here in Mosgiel to get to the Dunedin CBD.


