EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1 This is a report for an application for the renewal of an off-licence for the premises situated at 384 George Street, Dunedin, and known as "Quicker Liquor". The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- 2 The applicant dd not seek any changes to the licence however, after discussion with the reporting agencies, the licence hours will be reduced.
- 3 Public Notice of the renewal did not attract any objections. The Police has opposed the application and has suggested the inclusion of extra conditions, and this is supported by the Licensing Inspector.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

- 4 The Applicant company, MJ Enterprises Limited, has two director/shareholders, Mrs P McCarthy and Mr K McCarthy. They have several businesses operating off-licence premises in Dunedin.
- 5 The licence for this premises was first issued on 15 May 2013 by the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority after it had been opposed by the Police and Licensing Inspector. At the hearing the parties indicated they wanted to negotiate an outcome which was subsequently confirmed by the Authority.



6 The licensed hours of the first licence were Monday to Sunday 8.00 am to 11.00 pm. The closing time was amended to 10.00 pm at the 2017 renewal.

PUBLIC NOTICE

- 7 Public Notice of renewal application did not attract any objections.
- 8 The reporting agencies, Police, Medical Office of Health and Licensing Inspector have reported. The Police has opposed the renewal application but seeks two additional conditions to be included on the licence if the renewal is granted. The Licensing Inspector supports the stance of the Police. The Medical Officer of Health has no issue with the application.

Police

- 9 The Police concern is related to the type of product being sold in an area that targets the vulnerable student market community as well as the inner-city homeless population.
 - a) The sale of single serve, high alcohol content at cheap prices is contrary to the object of the Act. Selling these products in single units, within the community the premises is situated, is exposing people to higher levels of harm.
 - b) The suitability of the licensee is questionable because they are knowingly carrying out the sale of the abovementioned products.
 - c) The amenity and good order of the area is affected by the sale of alcohol to residents in the area where flat parties are often the subject of Police calls for service. While there is no evidence directly relating the alcohol consumed in these situations as being bought from this premises, it is one of the closest off-licences to the area of high Police demand.
- 10 The Police believe that the inclusion of a condition to exclude external advertising of alcohol and that there shall be no single unit sales of RTDs, shots or beer or cider in containers of 500 ml or less, with the exception of craft beer, would help mitigate further alcohol-related harm in the area.

Licensing Inspector

- 11 The Licensing Inspector agrees with the Police position that the two suggested conditions for inclusion on the licence would create a fairer and even playing field for off-licence premises in the city.
- 12 The Inspector has twice requested a copy of the store's roster, but this has not been supplied. The reason for the request was to confirm there were sufficient staff to ensure compliance with the provisions of the employment laws.
- 13 The suitability of the applicant is in doubt because the information supplied appears to show there is insufficient staff rostered to cover legally required breaks during a shift. An email sent by the applicant shows only one person to cover operating hours of 10.00 am to 10.00 pm.

CONCLUSION

14 This application is for the renewal of an off-licence situated in the northern end of George Street's shopping precinct. This area is close to student residential accommodation and the Police comment is that they are regularly receiving calls for service to alcohol-fuelled disorder.



- 15 The main issue for the Police is the sale of single unit, high alcohol drinks at cheap prices.
- 16 They have suggested the inclusion of two conditions to the licence: to not have external advertising/promotion of alcohol and the prohibition of selling single units of RTDs, shots, beer or cider in containers 500 ml or less. This would not include craft beer.
- 17 The Licensing Inspector has questioned the staffing of the premises. It would appear that there are insufficient staff rostered to comply with the employment laws in New Zealand and this is exacerbated by the applicant not supplying rosters when requested.
- 18 The applicant has agreed to a reduction in licensed hours to better reflect their trading practice. The new hours would be Monday to Sunday 10.00 am to 10.00 pm.




Host Responsibility Policy

Under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

The management and staff of Quicker Liquor believe that we have a responsibility to provide an environment that is not only comfortable and welcoming but also where alcohol is sold responsibly. Because of this the following Host Responsibility Policy has been implemented:

- We provide a range of non-alcoholic drinks, including low and zero alcohol beer, fruit juices, soft drinks and water.
- It is against the law to serve minors or have them on our premises without parental/legal guardian supervision.
- If we believe you look under 30 we will ask for identification. If you are part of a Group then all will be asked to provide ID.
- Acceptable forms of identification are: photo New Zealand drivers licence, Kiwi Access card or a current passport.
- We regularly check our outside to ensure no underage person is trying to entice any other person to purchase alcohol for them.
- Patrons who are visibly intoxicated WILL NOT be served and will be asked to leave the premises. We will promote transport options to get you home safely.
- We will display signage required under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act.2012
- We will maintain a training and management policy to give our staff the skills and support they need to do their job responsibly.

On 05/05/2022 Police received an application from M J Enterprises Limited for the renewal of the Off-Licence for the premises known as Quicker Liquor.

This is a busy premises situated on George Street, Dunedin Central, near the five-way intersection of Frederick, London and Pitt Streets. The target market for this premises is the student population that resides nearby, as well as the central Dunedin business district.

It is undisputed that this student population is regarded as a vulnerable community in regard to Alcohol Harm. Furthermore, this premises is located on the main street in Dunedin, impacting upon and exposing vulnerable passersby to the influence of alcohol, children and homeless included.

As such Police oppose the renewal of this licence under Section 105:

- (a) Object of the Act
- (b) Suitability of the applicant
- (h) amenity and good order
- (i) amenity and good order already badly effected

It also falls short of section 106(iii), in regard to number of current premises of the same kind in the area.

Object of the Act

- (1) The object of this Act is that-
 - (a) The sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and
 - (b) The harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimized.

(2) for the purposes of subsection (1), the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol includes-

(a) any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness or injury, directly or indirectly caused or directly or indirectly contributed to, by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol; and
(b) any harm to society generally or the community, directly or indirectly caused or directly or indirectly contributed to, by any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness or injury of a kind described in paragraph (a)

The sale of single serve, high octane alcohol at a cheap price does not align with the object of the act in that the vulnerable community in which this premises is situated are exposed to higher levels of harm. This point is particularly relevant for the homeless community that frequent George Street and Dunedin City. Furthermore, the advertising of alcohol on the external surrounds of the premises is exposing an already vulnerable community to further harm.

Suitability of the Applicant


Single sales of high octane alcohol at a cheap price adversely effects the suitability of the applicant. External advertising and promotion is a method to drive sales and revenue, this promotional material within a busy central city area exposes vulnerable passerby to the influence of alcohol.

Amenity and good order

Police records of alcohol related incidents in the area indicate high calls for Police service in Dunedin City where alcohol is a contributing factor. Flat parties in the surrounding areas of London Street, and further east into Frederick Street, and George Street are a weekly occurrence that are attended by Police. Alcohol consumed at these events are all purchased at nearby offlicences, of which Quicker Liquor is one of the closest. Furthermore, this premises is situated within the Dunedin City Alcohol Ban area, thus increasing the risk of breaching this ban should customers continue to be persuaded to buy single sales.

Whilst Police have no statistics that directly correlate alcohol harm back to this premises, it is almost certain alcohol purchased at this premises results in nearby harm. The NZ Police Geospatial mapping application has provided the map below showing the location of the premises well within an area of the high deprivation and harm.
