EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1 This is a report for an application by Akuhata Limited for the renewal of an on-licence for the premises situated at 4 King Edward Street, Dunedin, and known as "The Kensington". The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- 2 The applicant did not seek any changes to the licence however, after discussion with the Licensing Inspector, they have agreed to change in the opening time from 8.00 am to 10.00 am. The closing time of 2.00 am will remain unchanged.
- 3 There were no public objections to the application however the Licensing Inspector has opposed this renewal. Neither the Police nor Medical Officer of Health Delegate have opposed the renewal, but they support the position of the Inspector.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

Applicant

4 The applicant company, when the licence was granted on 21 July 2021, had two directors/shareholders. They were Cameron Akuhata Dylan Salisbury and Conrad William Hunaara Salisbury. A check of the Companies Register shows the sole director and shareholder to be Emma Rookes who was appointed on 28 September 2022.



- 5 Cameron A D Salisbury ceased being a director on 6 August 2022. Errin Rongomaianiwaniwa Salisbury was appointed a director on 8 August 2022 in place of Conrad W H Salisbury who also ceased being a director on this date.
- 6 Errin R Salisbury ceased being a director on 5 October 2022.
- 7 Section 69(1) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 requires the company to notify the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority of any change in shareholding or directors within 10 working days. The Authority will then notify the appropriate District Licensing Committee of the change and whether the company needs to apply for a new licence. The Committee has not been advised of the changes therefore can assume the Authority have not been advised of any of the changes.
- 8 The premises, one of the early hotels in Dunedin, is situated on the edge of a large sports reserve that is also used for entertainment purposes

PUBLIC NOTICE

- 9 The public notice of the renewal did not attract any opposition.
- 10 The Police and Medical Officer of Health Delegate have not opposed the renewal, but they are in support of the opposition on the Licensing Inspector.

Objections

- 11 *Licensing Inspector*: The Inspector has made several comments after the visit to the premises by the reporting agencies:
 - a) Questions relating to the suitability of the applicant: comments about being willing to open at 8.00 am for televised UFC fights and to serve alcohol at this time of morning and not notifying the Authority of the change in directors/shareholders.
 - b) A lack of signage in the premises. This was highlighted in the first visit was still absent when the Inspector visited the following week.
 - c) A serious assault and a fight took place at the premises between June and August 2022, and neither were reported to the Police. When asked why they were tole, "We take care of matters here ourselves."
 - d) The applicant could not produce an incident log, managers logs or evidence of staff training.
 - e) Concern at some of the alcohol promotions and the use of a loyalty card.
- 12 The Inspector does not believe the applicant is aware of their obligations under the Act. The opposition of the Inspector related to the suitability of the applicant (s.105(b)) and whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the Act (s.105(j).

CONCLUSION

13 The applicant has agreed to a reduction in trading hours by delaying the opening of the premises to 10.00 am.



14 The Inspector has raised concerns so the hearing will allow the parties to put their points of view to the Committee for consideration.

They do not appear to be aware of their obligations under the Act: they have changed directors/shareholders without notification, two serious assaults have occurred at the premises which have not been brought to the attention of the Police and no on-site records were able to be produced, and there is confusion about alcohol promotions which include a loyalty card. Other matters included accessible water in the premises.

The current sole director and 100% shareholder is Errin Rongomaianiwaniwa SALISBURY. Ms Salisbury was appointed sole director and sole shareholder on 6 and 8 August 2022 (as per company register records). Previously, Ms Salisbury was an original director of this company (since its incorporation date), however ceased being a director on 22 November 2020.

Cameron Akuhata Dylan SALISBURY ceased being a director of Akuhata Limited on 6 August 2022 and ceased being a shareholder on 8 August 2022.

Conrad William Hunaara SALISBURY ceased being a director and shareholder of Akuhata Limited on 8 August 2022.

It is my understanding that the applicant failed to notify the secretary of the licensing authority of any change in company shareholders/directors within the required 10 working days after the change occurred as per section 69 (1) (a) and (b) of The Act. This calls into question the suitability of the applicant and their awareness of company changes which may affect their alcohol licence.

Harold Salisbury is sole shareholder and director of KAIDA HOSPITALITY LIMITED. This company held the licence for Bamboo Restaurant and Saltwater Café, Tauranga, that was placed into liquidation following a petition from IRD in October 2020. Errin Rongomaianiwaniwa Salisbury was removed as a director of this company on 14 July 2019 and removed as a shareholder of this company on 30 July 2020.

General nature of the business (description/background/previously licensed)

The Kensington tavern is located by The Oval (sports/recreation ground) and is a longestablished tavern with a function room, garden bar and restaurant.

Industrial. Resource consent (2005-350389) allows the activity.

Monday to Sunday 10am – 2am. See email from applicant confirming these hours, which differ from those originally indicated within the application.

Licensing hours were discussed with Harold Salisbury (17^{th} August) then later Conrad and Cameron Salisbury (24^{th} August). Cameron and Conrad explained occasionally the premises may open early morning E.g. 8am if a UFC fight (pay per view event) was being televised on the big screen.

In this instance, the current licensing hours (8am – 2am, seven days a week) would allow alcohol sales from 8am, which Cameron and Conrad indicated could happen and they would allow to happen, stating "that's how we make money". This statement raised suitability concerns for the agencies present, in terms of possible harm and who would be purchasing alcohol early in the morning during such events. When questioned as to who would be purchasing alcohol at this hour, the reply was "you'd be surprised".

During the onsite interview, a quick review of the premises social media (for 2022) indicated approximately 1 UFC fight (televised/advertised) advertised on social media per month, with only two such adverts having nominated event (screening) times, both of which were in the afternoon.

The applicant was subsequently asked to reconsider what licensing hours they would seek, considering when the premises trades/opens. Current trading hours are approximately 11am – late, seven days a week.

The applicant has now nominated 10am – 2am over seven days for their requested licensing hours, confirmed via email.

Are there any changes from the existing licence or Temporary Authority?

Yes, a reduction of licensing hours from 8am - 2am daily to 10am - 2am daily - refer to above.

Water signage was absent in the downstairs bar, and readily accessible free drinking water was difficult to determine in terms of availability. The applicant informed us during the onsite interviews that patrons could always ask for water at the bar (water bottles were in the fridge behind the bar), and that there was a water tap at one end of the bar. The water tap was on the bar side of the counter (as opposed to customer side) and no obvious stack of glasses/vessels were available by this tap to indicate customers could help themselves to water. Whilst free water was arguably available, it wasn't necessarily obvious how in my opinion.

The upstairs bar had no signage in relation to taxi's and no duty manager's name displayed. Whilst 'one venue' it is recommended that at every point of sale (ie: upstairs bar as well as in the main bar downstairs) the manager's name and appropriate signage is displayed in both locations. This was discussed with Harold during the initial visit on 17 August and had not been remedied by the follow-up visit with Conrad and Cameron on 24 August.

The changes in company director/shareholders for Akuhata Limited that occurred 6-8 August 2022, were not notified to the secretary of the licensing committee which indicates a lack of suitability and awareness by the applicant to inform the secretary of the licensing committee of such changes under section 69 of The Act.

Two serious assaults (an assault and a fight) occurred at this premises between June and August 2022, one of which incident's resulted in a staff member being 'bottled' in the head. The Police Alcohol Harm Prevention Officer was not made aware of either assault within the premises and only learned about these incidents during the initial onsite interview on 17 August 2022. Upon questioning the applicant about these assaults, the reply from Harold Salisbury as to why Police weren't informed was 'We take care of matters here ourselves'.

At both interviews on the 17th and 24th August, records were requested by the agencies to be viewed of any incidents, managers logs, staff training etc. No records were able to be produced at either interview. Cameron and Conrad indicated some incidents were recorded, but evidence of this was unable to be sighted by the agencies.

Serve wise was discussed with Harold on 17 August and recommended for all staff to undertake (and keep records on file once this training had been completed).

A 'K Card' loyalty card is available. There was some confusion over what the card holders receive with this card. Conrad and Cameron explained the card gives the holder 6% discount on everything (drinks and food); however how this card is advertised on social media suggests 6 cents is earnt on every dollar spent which can then either be spent or saved. I asked Conrad and Cameron that based on how this card was advertised on Facebook, one could reasonably presume that over time with credit building up, in theory alcohol could be acquired for 'free' by way of credit. Both Conrad and Cameron stated this was not how the card worked, however this advertising (online) is misleading in my opinion.

Inspector's comment

This report is prepared for the District Licensing Committee's consideration.

In my opinion, the applicant is not fully aware of their obligations under the Act in relation to reporting changes within their company structure, demonstrating an awareness of signage and accessibility of free water, and confusion over alcohol promotions such as the 'K card' loyalty scheme and \$10 mystery shot, both of which could be seen to contribute towards and encourage consumption of alcohol in an irresponsible manner, which may potentially cause harm.

In addition, through discussions with the applicant around licensing hours sought, comments made in relation to being willing to sell alcohol to any person from 8am as this is 'how we make money' whilst not illegal, raises concerns about responsible alcohol sales.

The lack of record keeping, especially in relation to assaults/fight's that occurred in and around the premises are cause for concern and raise questions around staff training and systems in place to reduce alcohol related harm and the responsible sale of alcohol as well.

For the above reasons, I oppose this application based under section 105 (b) (Suitability of the applicant) and (j) (Whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff, and training to comply with the law) of the Act.


I have considered this application with respect to the public health issues involved. This report advises NO OPPOSITION, however I wish to make comment.

On Wednesday 24th August 2022, Joanne Lee a health promotion advisor from the National Public Health Service - Te Waipounamu, visited the above premises on behalf of the Medical Officer of Health and met with Conrad and Cameron Salisbury. All agencies were present during this meeting. During the visit the premises was assessed for compliance with the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

Although the report from Ms Lee was not unfavourable, it did raise some concerns that I would like to bring to the attention of the DLC.

Cameron and Conrad Salisbury stated their staff training consisted of on the job training, mentoring/buddy system and induction process. No records have been kept to support this. Five certified managers are employed, however nothing has been recorded in the managers register. National Public Health service staff will be continue to monitor these premises along with our partner agencies.
