EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This is a report for the extension of a Temporary Authority of the premises situated at 343 George Street, Dunedin, and known as "Tokyo Garden".
- The original application was opposed by the Licensing Inspector and Police but, because of the time of year, the Committee decided to issue the temporary authority until 27 January 2023 at which time a hearing for the substantive licence application would be heard, assuming the applicant had submitted it on time.
- An application was received but, due to a technical issue only resolved on 18 January, the detail in the main application was unreadable and supporting documents were not attached.
- 4 This hearing is to rehear the original temporary authority application and to consider the information in the reports of the Police and Licensing Inspector.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

Applicant

The applicant company has two directors, Leonard CHENG and Chengyu ZHANG (also known as Chris ZHANG) with the latter being the sole shareholder. There was a change in the company structure with a former director and sole shareholder, Ms Yingjie GAO, ws replaced by Mr



- ZHANG. The change in company structure was not notified to the Alcohol Regulatory and Licensing Authority as required by section 69 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
- The Committee asked for a temporary authority application to be submitted as soon as possible after the breach was identified in November 2022. This was subsequently received, and both the Police and Licensing Inspector opposed the grant of the authority. It was decided to issue the authority with the applicant being advised to apply for the substantive licence as soon as possible so a hearing could be convened on 27 January 2023.
- An application was received by Council prior to the Christmas/New Year closure period however, it was not 'readable' by the computer system being used, despite the form being used was editable .pdf documented accessed on the Council website. The application was returned advising it was incomplete and that supporting documentation was required.
- 8 A 'work-around' has now enabled the missing form data to be read but the supporting data has still not been received.
- The hearing for the full licence cannot be convened however, because the temporary authority will need to be extended, a short-notice hearing to rehear the original application has been called for the same date, 27 January 2023, so the original opposition by the Police and Licensing Inspector can be considered before an extension of the temporary authority is determined. The ability for the Committee to rehear this matter, at short notice, is found at sections 136(3) and 201(4) of the Act.

OBJECTIONS

Temporary authority applications are not required to be publicly advertised but they are circulated to the Police and Licensing Inspector.

Objections

- Police: The Police opposition relates the suitability of Mr ZHANG. On 29 July 2022 Mr ZHANG, 26 years of age, was convicted for unlawfully carrying an imitation firearm during an incident in a licensed premises in Dunedin's George Street in the early hours of 4 June 2022. He was intoxicated at the time of the incident. Another charge of presenting that imitation firearm was withdrawn by Police.
- 12 Mr ZHANG is essentially the operator of Tokyo Garden, but this incident raises questions as to his suitability to be operating a licensed premises.
- Licensing Inspector: The Licensing Inspector identified the change in company structure while at the premises for a Food Licence check. The second director, Mr CHENG, has been involved with licensed restaurants for a number of years but in this instance, did not notify the Authority of the change in directorship and shareholding.
- Tokyo Garden has continued to sell alcohol since the change in February 2022 when they should have notified the Authority and, because of the shareholding change, should have applied for a new licence.
- 15 The Licensing Inspector raises questions as to the suitability of the applicant company to have an alcohol licence.



CONCLUSION

- This original hearing for the substantive on-licence application is not able to take place. The application was not able to be read at the time it was received and was not accompanied by the required supporting documents. While the application can now be 'read', the other documents are not available so public notification cannot take place nor the application circulated to the reporting agencies.
- 17 The temporary authority was issued for a very short period to allow the substantive application to be received, circulated and reported on so it could be determined at this hearing.
- To continue with the current temporary authority the Committee has decided to rehear the matter to hear the positions of the Police and Licensing Inspector and then decide whether to extend it's expiry date.






Tokyo Garden Temporary Authority Alcohol Licence application

Evidence of: Tanya Jeanette Morrison, Environmental Health Officer & Alcohol Licensing Inspector, Dunedin City Council.

- 1. My name is Tanya Jeanette Morrison and I am an Environmental Health Officer and Alcohol Licensing Inspector employed by Dunedin City Council since 6 December 2010. I hold a current warrant of appointment (issued by Dunedin City Council) for both above-mentioned roles, and I am also a recognised verifier and warranted Food Safety Officer under The Food Act 2014.
- 2. I became aware of the change in ownership for Tokyo Garden when I contacted the business on 29 November 2022 to arrange their food verification under the Food Act and was informed that Chengyu Zhang (Chris) was the new owner of the business.
- 3. Chengyu (Chris) Zhang was appointed a company director and sole shareholder of Tokyo Garden Food Limited on 01/02/2022. At this time, Yingjin (Ivy) Gao ceased being a director and the sole shareholder.
- 4. Leonard Cheng is the other company director (no shares held), but as confirmed through discussions with Mr Zhang is not actively involved in the day to day running of the business in any
- 5. During a food verification revisit to Tokyo Garden on 22 December 2022 at 11am where I was accompanied by Carlo Bell (Team Leader Environmental Health/Chief Licensing Inspector Dunedin City Council), Mr Zhang and I discussed the sale of alcohol within his premises.
- 6. I asked Mr Zhang if Yingjin Gao (Ivy), the former owner and only listed duty manager for the premises worked every day. Mr Zhang replied that Ms Gao only worked a couple of days a week.
- 7. I asked Mr Zhang if he sells alcohol every day, even if Ms Gao is not working and Mr Zhang replied yes, he did.
- 8. I enquired with Mr Zhang if he had employed any other duty managers besides Ms Gao, reminding him that Ms Gao was the only (listed) duty manager to my knowledge for the premises. Mr Zhang told me he had his licence to sell alcohol as well.
- 9. I asked Mr Zhang what licence he thought he had, as to the best of my knowledge he did not hold a current manager's certificate. Mr Zhang replied he had the LCQ qualification so believed he was licensed to sell alcohol. I clarified that holding a LCQ qualification did not make him a certified duty manager and that alcohol can only be sold when a current certified duty manager is present onsite.
- 10. I clearly stated to Mr Zhang that no alcohol was to be sold unless a current certified duty manager was onsite and working.
- 11. Carlo and I left the premises at approximately 11.30am.

Additional Comments	The change in ownership only came to notice when I contacted the business on 29 November 2022 to arrange their food verification under the Food Act and was informed that Chengyu Zhang (Chris) was the new owner of the business.
	The other company director, Leonard Cheng is well known in Dunedin and has been involved in several companies, some of which have operated several food premises previously.
	As a director of Tokyo Garden Food Limited which has been operating as a licensed premises since 2016 and being involved with various other companies, Mr Cheng should have been aware of the need to notify any change of director/shareholder or 'ownership' in the broader sense for both Alcohol and Food licences yet failed to do so.
	It is my understanding that Tokyo Garden has continued to sell alcohol since this company structure change occurred in February 2022. The previous owner Yingjin (Ivy) Gao is the only current duty manager working at the premises.
	I oppose this application based on suitability, given the unnotified change of ownership that occurred in February 2022 and the probable continuation of alcohol sales that have occurred since that time, along with an insufficient number of duty managers.

APPLICATION FOR TEMPORARY AUTHORITY – TA-25-2022 : - TOKYO GARDEN FOOD LIMITED

Dear Sir/Madam,

On 5th December 2022 Police received an application from the above-named applicant, for a Temporary authority for the On Licence Premises known as 'Tokyo Garden'. This premises is situated at 345 George Street, Dunedin Central. Current On Licence number is 069/ON/13/2017.

The individual acting on behalf of the applicant is Chengyu (Chris) Zhang. Police have conducted an enquiry through the NZ Companies Register and discovered that Mr ZHANG is one of two company directors, and the sole shareholder for Tokyo Garden Food Ltd, trading as Tokyo Garden.

Police have noted on the 29th July 2022, Mr ZHANG was convicted and sentenced for one charge of *Unlawful Carry Imitation Firearm*. He was also charged by Police with *Present Thing Likely to be Believed to be Prohibited Firearm at Person*, however this charge was withdrawn.

The circumstances in relation to these charges has been taken from the Police Summary of Facts and outlined below:

The victim in this matter is an 18 year old male who is not known to the defendant ZHANG.

At 3.00am on the 4th of June 2022, the defendant was in George Street, Dunedin with an associate. The victim stopped to talk to the defendant and asked him if he knew where any scooters were so they could get home.

The defendant told the victim he knew where scooters were and told him to go over to his vehicle. The defendant reached into the vehicle and pulled a starting pistol out of the driver's side door of the vehicle.

Sgt Steve Jones, QID : SJCT35, Dunedin Central Email : sict35@police.govt.nz Phn : 021191275 The defendant cocked the pistol and pointed it in the direction of the victim. The victim, believing the starting pistol was a working firearm, took off running along George Street, thinking he was about to be shot.

The defendant went on to show the pistol to a number of other passers-by and Police were called.

The defendant walked into Zanzibar at 311 George Street, Dunedin, took the gun out of the waistband of his track pants and placed it on the bar.

As the defendant came out of the bar he was challenged by Police and arrested. The pistol located in the waistband of his trousers.

In explanation the defendant stated that he thought it was okay because it was a blank firing pistol and he had it to protect himself.

The defendant is a 26-year-old male who has not previously appeared before

Subsequent enquiries with the officer in charge of the investigation have confirmed Mr ZHANG was intoxicated at the time of the offence, the incident has occurred nearby and inside a licenced premises, and the officer has noted alcohol as a contributing factor on the original offence report.

The conviction and associated aggravating factors call into question Mr ZHANGs suitability to be granted any alcohol licence, or even run a licenced premises. Furthermore, Mr ZHANG has failed to notify the authority and agencies of the change of ownership and continued to trade. This shows a lack of candor and further calls into question his knowledge of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

Police oppose this application under the following section of the Act,

Section 105(1)(b) the suitability of the applicant

Police submit the committee consider Osborne LLA PH2388/95:

"Without fettering ourselves in this or other applications, it may be helpful if we indicate that we commonly look for a five-year period free of any serious conviction or any conviction relating to or involving the abuse of alcohol or arising in the course of an applicant's duty on licensed premises".

Police further submit the conviction would appear to fall within the language concerning 'serious conviction' as noted above.

Police would expect Mr ZHANG to demonstrate his suitability by remaining free of negative dealings with Police for at least 5 years from the date of the offence that caused the most recent conviction. After which any further application submitted by the applicant would be placed under the same scrutiny as any other licence application.

Comments:	Both the Police and Licensing Inspector oppose this application. The Inspector on the grounds of suitability because the change in directorship and shareholding was not notified to ARLA. The Police for the same reason as well as the sole shareholder has a serious conviction and suggests a five year standdown.
	The applicant is a company. There are two directors – one of whom was changed in February 2022 while the other has been a director since 2016. The sole shareholder has changed from Yingjin GAO to the current Chengyu ZHANG.
	GAO remains working at the premises as the only certified manager. ZHANG is not a certified manager and there is no application in the system indicating he is applying for one at this stage.
	The Police opposition and the suggestion of a five- year standdown is more aligned with a manager's certificate application.
	The failure to notify the change in directorship and shareholding relates to the applicant company as does the suitability of the sole shareholder.
	The premises has not come to the attention of the agencies so one must assume it is being operated properly.
	Due to circumstance and the time of year, there is no ability to convene a short-notice hearing.

DISPLAY OF TEMPORARY AUTHORITY

A copy of this temporary authority <u>must</u> be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises.

CONDITIONS

This temporary authority is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1.00 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday

11.00 am to 12.00 midnight

- (c) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - (i) A range of food choices must be readily available at all times that the premises is open. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted. A minimum of three types of food should be available. The range or style of food will be shown on any menu submitted. Alternatively, the range of food should include such items as paninis, pizzas, lasagne, toasted or fresh sandwiches, wedges, pies, filled rolls, and/or salads.
 - (ii) A range of low alcohol and non-alcoholic drinks must be readily available at all times the premises is open.
 - (iii) Water must be freely available at all times that the premises is open.
- (d) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - (i) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (e) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
