# REPORT FOR OPPOSED ON-LICENCE, "SPEIGHT'S HERITAGE CENTRE", 200 RATTRAY STREET, DUNEDIN – FROM SECRETARY, DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- This is a report for an application for a renewal of an on-licence for the premises situated at 200 Rattray Street, Dunedin, and known as the "Speight's Heritage Centre". The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- The applicant does not seek any changes to the licence. The inspector considers that the sale and supply of alcohol under these conditions are consistent with the purpose of the Act and meets the criteria at section 131.
- Public notice of the application attracted an objection from the Students for Sensible Drug Policy Ōtepoti-Dunedin.
- 4 Neither of the reporting agencies have opposed this application. The inspector does not oppose this application.

#### **APPLICANT AND APPLICATION**

- 5 The Applicant is Lion NZ Limited. They took over the running of Speight's Brewery in about 1977.
- The licence allows the Applicant to offer tastings at the end of tours of the brewery and to host various functions.



- 7 The Applicant does not seek any change to the current licence hours which are Monday to Sunday, 9.00 am to 1.00 am the following day.
- 8 There have been no issues associated with the premises.

#### **PUBLIC NOTICE**

- 9 Public notice of the application attracted on objection from Students for Sensible Drug Policy Ōtepoti-Dunedin (SSDP).
- 10 The Police, Medical Officer of Health and Licensing Inspector have not opposed the licence renewal.

#### Objection

- They state their grounds for objection are those "available grounds permitted on renewal under s105" of the Act. However, their objection relates only to the suitability of the Applicant (s.105(1)(b)) and the manner in which the Applicant has sold, displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol (s.131(1)(d)).
- Their concern relates to the Applicant company advertising alcohol on the exterior of "The Dairy" on Castle Street during Flo and O-Week at the university.
- 13 There is little detail included in the objection letter.

#### **CONCLUSION**

- 14 The renewal of this licence has not been opposed by the reporting agencies.
- 15 The Objector has questioned the suitability of the Applicant citing an occurrence unrelated to this premises.
- The hearing allows the parties to make submissions and present evidence for the Committee to consider before making a decision.



#### HOST RESPONSIBILITY

As good hosts our expectation is that you will enjoy your visit to our premises. - Any person displaying signs of intoxication will not be served further alcohol and may be asked to leave.
- Alternative drinks i.e., low and non-alcoholic beverages and food will be recommended when a person shows signs of escalating intoxication.

- Signage is displayed advising the range and nature of food available
- Staff will actively promote and encourage the consumption of food to slow the onset of intoxication.

We are sending you this letter on behalf of the members of Students for Sensible Drug Policy Ōtepoti-Dunedin (SSDP) to lodge an objection to the application for the renewal of license ON-14-2014 by Lion NZ Limited trading as Speight's Heritage Centre.

SSDP is affiliated with the Otago University Student Association (OUSA). The objective of SSDP is 'to reduce drug related harm and advocate for drug policy change in Dunedin and Aotearoa.' As has been recently reported on in the media, alcohol is the drug that is most used, and which causes the most harm in Aotearoa-New Zealand.

The core membership and primary focus of SSDP's work is the University of Otago and Otago Polytechnic student population, which section 1.3 of the Dunedin Local Alcohol Policy (LAP) specifically identifies and acknowledges that the student population is 'particularly vulnerable to hazardous drinking and alcohol-related harm.'

This objection is lodged on all the available grounds permitted on renewal under s105. of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 – but initially with specific regard to:

- 1. the object of the Act sections 3 and 4 and 105(1)(a), by the means of s 131 (1)(a);
- 2. the suitability of the applicant, including the criterion of extended suitability s 105(1)(b), by the means of s 131 (1)(a);





3. the manner in which the applicant has sold (or, as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol – s 131 (1)(d).

The primary grounds for this objection is under s 105(1)(b) - the suitability of the applicant, including the criterion of extended suitability; and furthermore, the manner in which the applicant has sold (or, as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol – s 131 (1)(d).

SSDP believes that the Applicant is unsuitable to hold a license, and furthermore the Dunedin District Licensing Committee in considering the renewal of this license must regard the manner this Applicant has advertised and promoted alcohol; given the Applicant's contribution to the onslaught of alcohol marketing during Flo and O Week targeting students by means of the Applicant's repainting of "The Dairy" on Castle Street with advertising for Lion's Hyoketsu RTD brand.

SSDP agrees with comments made in the media at the time by Sergeant Steve Jones, Dunedin alcohol harm reduction officer for the New Zealand Police, that it is concerning that this advertising occurring during Orientation week has a clear intention – that intention being to target Otago's student community with predatory alcohol marketing, at a time our community is at increased vulnerability to alcohol related harm.

We believe the Applicant's decision to market and promotion of their Hyoketsu RTD brand in this irresponsible way, in an irresponsible location, and with both irresponsible and unsafe timing, created further pressure for students to drink, and encouraged excessive and unsafe consumption of alcohol in our extremely vulnerable community.

SSDP believes that it is blindingly obvious the Applicant has no real understanding of the 'extremely common and commonly extreme' alcohol-related harm that occurs in North Dunedin – or otherwise they would have chosen not to advertise and promote their Hyoketsu RTD brand in such an irresponsible and unsafe manner, place, and time.

On that basis, SSDP holds that the Applicant not only fails to meet the grounds of suitability for the renewal of this license, but also critically fails the higher threshold of extended suitability given the vulnerable communities that reside within North and Central Dunedin.

To be extremely clear - SSDP acknowledges and fully accepts that the Speight's Heritage Centre is of great value to Dunedin - it is part of our history, and it is a great tourism attraction. Our primary basis of objection is not with the premises themselves (albeit there are some matters detailed on the Applicant's renewal paperwork we believe requires further explanation).





#### Students for Sensible Drug Policy Ōtepoti-Dunedin

Our primary grounds of objection is based on the suitability of the Applicant, further based on the manner in which the Applicant has advertised and promoted alcohol, that we believe has lead to the Applicant failing to meet the Object of the Act, let alone the reality of the additional harm the applicant's predatory alcohol marketing has caused within the vulnerable student community at a time where members of our community were most at risk of increased alcohol-related harm.

Section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 states:

- "131 Criteria for renewal
- (1) In deciding whether to renew a licence, the licensing authority or the licensing committee concerned must have regard to the following matters:
  - (a) the matters set out in paragraphs (a) to (g), (j), and (k) of section 105(1): (where s 105(1)(b) specifically concerns 'the suitability of the applicant)
  - (b) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence:
  - (c) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, an inspector, or a Medical Officer of Health made by virtue of section 129:
  - (d) the manner in which the applicant has sold (or, as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol."

SSDP thereby holds that the grounds stated above for our objection to renewal of license ON-14-2014 by Lion NZ Limited trading as Speight's Heritage Centre are valid and must be heard by the Dunedin District Licensing Committee.

We will provide detail for the grounds of objection referenced above, along with information about any further grounds of objection, in opening submissions.
