EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The Hearings Committee Dog Control Bylaw meet on Thursday 26 and 27 September to hear submitters who wished to speak to their submission. The meeting was adjourned and will reconvene on 29 October 2024 to consider the submissions.

Some other areas were brought to our attention but would require consultation for change, so could be flagged for attention at the next review, for example:

- Doctors Point Halo Project would like prohibited. Early engagement showed mixed views on rules at this beach. Coastal dunes and temporary signage rule would help protect wildlife at this beach while still allowing for an off-leash area in part of Dunedin where there are few off leash opportunities.
- Long Beach Wharewerawera Halo Project would like prohibited for part of this beach.
- Headlands and river mouths DOC would like blanket rule for all to be on leash. This was not consulted on (as not raised earlier) and there would likely be numerous affected parties. Flag for attention at the next bylaw review?
- St Clair beach St Clair Surf Club think it would be a good off leash area (currently prohibited) as the beach is changing, rarely any swimmers, and some sand at low tide. Not consulted on but could next review?
