5 TOITŪ OTAGO SETTLERS MUSEUM ACTIVITY REPORT

The report summarised activities of the Toitū Otago Settlers Museum (Toitū) from 1 October to 31 December 2023. The Toitū Director, Cam McCracken spoke to the report and responded to questions.

Visitation

Discussion was held about recent high visitation numbers, especially in December 2023, when 49,771 people visited Toitū. The increase in visitation was due to a number of factors, including the regular 'Christmas at Toitū' school holiday activities, music performances, the Pixie Town display and Santa photography. Additionally Toitū was used as the drop off and pick up point on days the Octagon was unavailable to shuttle buses transporting visitors from cruise ships.

Commercial Activity

The Toitū Director advised that operational efficiencies have led to increased sales volumes and profitability at the retail outlets at Toitū, the Art Gallery and Lan Yuan.

Work continues on collections policy and processes and updated documentation will be shared with the Board at the next meeting.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1 This report covers activities of Toitū Otago Settlers Museum (Toitū) from 1 January to 31 March 2024.

This report is prepared for the Toitū Otago Settlers Museum Board meeting and details the latest activities and KPI performance at Toitū.


DISCUSSION

Visitation

Toitū recorded 107,696 visitors in this quarter, representing a 28% increase compared with the same period in FY 22/23.

COLLECTIONS AND EXHIBITIONS

Exhibitions

- 4 Maintenance of permanent exhibits: The exhibitions team continuously maintain the quality of the permanent exhibits at Toitū. This programme of work includes cleaning, minor repair work and technology upgrades. This takes on increased importance during the summer months when the Museum has high visitation.
- Call to Arms and Roll of Honour: The team is working on scheduled object change outs to the Call to Arms Military exhibition as well as a major upgrade to the Roll of Honour. The Roll has been updated and visitors will be able to search using touchscreen and obtain a biography and a portrait image of most Roll nominees. The plan is to launch this new project to coincide with Armistice Day 2024.

Digital Outputs and Public Talks

- Three *Talking Pictures* episodes created by curator Peter Read on "Settler Portraits" in the Toitū collection were released to the Toitū YouTube channel.
- 7 "Donated rifle symbol of a bygone era" an article by Seán Brosnahan for the Otago Daily Times Cool and Collected series was published in late May.
- 8 Eight public talks or seminars were delivered as part of our public programme activities; topics covered included Coaching in the Victorian Era, Shipping to Dunedin and Irish Migration.

Collections

Acquisitions

9 A total of 76 items have been added to the collection this reporting period, including sporting costume from the Leith Harriers Club, an abacus used in a Chinese-owned business and correspondence and ephemera relating to the iconic Admiral Byrd Antarctic expedition of 1929,



which departed from Dunedin and in which Byrd completed the first plane flight over the South Pole.

Collections Projects

- Asbestos Testing and Collection Access: In March the team completed testing of the costume and textile store S106. The results have confirmed a low risk level of ACD contamination which will be remediated enabling full access to be regained to this store.
- 11 Firearms Collection Audit and Relocation: Several team members are nearing completion of the new firearms licensing required for the Museum to maintain its firearms collection. Once this licensing process is complete, the team will proceed with auditing and improving the storage of this collection.
- Records management, Registry and Curatorial Workroom: The team completed a clean and reorganisation of the registry and curatorial workrooms and resource rooms. An audit of collection documentation is also underway, including the re-incorporation of collection records which were previously stored offsite. This is a complex programme of work and is planned for completion by the end of June.
- Collection Development: The collections team continues to work on updating our collection recording and database processes including the creation of a collection development plan to guide our collecting into the future.

Conservation Projects

- 14 Integrated Pest Management: The team has continued with IPM work.
- 15 Quarantine store: 148 items were processed bringing the processing of acquisitions up to date.

Archives

- Staffing: Enquiries are currently being managed by sharing these duties across the team and by encouraging customers to undertake self-guided genealogical research online and through the research centre.
- 17 Collections and Exhibitions staff processed 63 public enquiries, all by email/correspondence.

AUDIENCE DEVELOPMENT

Enriching Local Curriculum (ELC) – Education

Themes taught in our early childhood, primary and secondary programmes have included the early traveling conditions for the nuns who founded St Hilda's Collegiate, Chinese New Year Celebrations/ the Year of the Dragon, Kai Tahu narratives, the Ara I te Uru gallery, connections to place, ko wai au?, buy/sell/trade, general museum exploration, and boats.

Visitor Programmes

- 19 A snapshot of some of the wide variety of self-guided gallery trails, public talks, workshops, demonstrations and performances during this reporting period are as follows:
- 20 Regular community demonstrations and 'have a go' style offerings in the Josephine Foyer by local community groups are very popular and this reporting period have included



demonstrations by the Dunedin Spinners and Weavers Guild, the Otago Embroiders' Guild, weekly Sunday afternoon dancing, and Toddler Time.

- The regular Tuesday Club Talks in association with the Otago Settlers Association have featured Father Tony, Dean of Dunedin on the history of St Paul's Anglican Cathedral, Emeritus Professor Adrian Shubert and Associate Professor Boyd Cothran of York University speaking about The Edwin Fox, and Kim Morgan, Director of the Dunedin Summer Shakespeare Company, who spoke about its history and future. As part of our *Migration to Otago* series there were presentations about Chinese music in Otago, and Irish immigration to southern New Zealand.
- Other programmes at Toitū have included a Pride quilt making session (as part of NZ Pride Month), a portrait photobooth in the Smith Gallery, the annual Burns Night Supper, the opening event for Dunedin Multi-Ethnic Council's race relations week, and performances as part of our Toitū Sounds programme.

COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY

- There was a 60% increase in sales in the Toitū gift shop this reporting period. This jump in revenue is largely due to the large increase in local visitation, domestic travellers and cruise ship visitors.
- There were ten venue hire functions at Toitū over the reporting period and the team assisted with other functions, events and group bookings at Toitū Otago Settlers Museum as well as Lan Yuan Dunedin Chinese Garden.
