EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1 This is a report for an application for the renewal of on and off-licences for "Mackies Hotel", situated at 14 George Street, Port Chalmers. The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- 2 The applicant does not seek any changes to the licences.
- 3 There were no public objections to the application but both the Medical Officer of Health Delegate and Licensing Inspector have raised matters in opposition to the renewals. Fire and Emergency NZ (FENZ) have also raised a concern

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

- 4 The applicant company, Sefton Holdings Limited, has two directors and equal shareholders, Wayne and Desiree Sefton. They have been at the premises since about 1985. The applicant has also had other premises in the past.
- 5 The business has a bar, gaming area, a small bottle store and also has accommodation available.



PUBLIC NOTICE

- 6 Public notice of the applications did not attract any objections.
- 7 The applications were circulated to the reporting agencies and FENZ.
- 8 Both the Licensing Inspector and Medical Officer of Health (MoH) Delegate have both opposed the applications. During a monitoring visit on 12 April 2025, they found issues and these form the basis of their opposition: The issues include:
- 9 No duty manager on site and the premises was open and trading
- 10 There was no food advertised and the person present did not know what, if any, food was available
- 11 While water was available, it had to be requested at the bar.
- 12 Both the Inspector and MoH Delegate questions the suitability of the applicant to hold a licence, and whether the premises had appropriate systems, staff, or training to comply with the legislation. They also question whether the object of the Act was being upheld in these circumstances.
- 13 FENZ also advised that there was no recorded trial evacuation from the premises in the past two years. They are following this up with the applicant directly.
- 14 Building Services are following up on a expired Building Warrant of Fitness. They note that they will most likely issue a Notice to Fix because an external fire escape has been removed and, because of the age of the building, it needs to be replaced.
- 15 The Police did not report on the applications.

CONCLUSION

- 16 While the applicant has had the premises for about 40 years, the Licensing Inspector and MoH Delegate identified issues which raises doubts as to the suitability of the applicant to hold alcohol licences.
- 17 This hearing is an opportunity for the applicant to present their points of view and the corrective actions taken to address the concerns raised by the agencies.



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

Inspector's comment

This report is prepared for the District Licensing Committee's consideration.

Routine monitoring occurred at various sites across Dunedin on Saturday 12 April 2025. This premises was visited, and it was found that the named duty manager was not present onsite whilst alcohol was being sold.

The staff member present, when asked about available food options, could not locate a menu within the bar, nor could advise of three substantial food options available onsite.

Whilst copies of the current licences were observed near the main entrance to the premises, a copy of the On-Alcohol licence was also on display behind the bar near the mug wall, which expired in 2019.

A copy of the monitoring report from 12 April 2025 will be provided as evidence to the committee along with hearing submissions.

Due to the lack of manager onsite, and lack of advertised food options, this brings into question the suitability of the applicant and the object of the Act.

Section 105 (a) The Object of the Act, 105 (b) The Suitability of the applicant, 105 (J) having appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law, along with provisions of section 53 of the Act in relation to food availability are all called into question.

This application is opposed as I believe the committee would benefit from addressing the identified issues with the applicant directly.

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Opposition to Renewal of Alcohol Licences (On-Licence and Off-Licence) – Mackies Hotel, Port Chalmers

Further to the interim opposition this is formalize health's opposition for the renewal of both the on-licence and off-licence held by Mackies Hotel, located in Port Chalmers, under section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

My opposition is based on serious compliance concerns that were observed during an official site inspection, and which directly relate to the criteria set out in section 131(1) and section 105 of the Act.

Site Inspection – 12 April 2025

On 12 April 2025, a compliance inspection was conducted jointly by:

- Tania Morrison, Chief Licensing Inspector, and
- Aaron Whipp, Medical Officer of Health delegate.

During this inspection, the following non-compliance issues were identified:

- No food was available for purchase or consumption on the premises.
- The duty manager was not present on site, despite the premises being open and trading under both the on- and off-licence.
- Water was available, However, needed to be asked for and not actively promoted.

These are clear breaches of licence conditions and raise significant concerns about the operation of the premises.

Inadequate Food Availability (Section 53)

Under the on-licence, the license is required to always provide substantial food that alcohol is being sold or supplied for consumption on the premises. The absence of food provision:

- Fails to support the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- Undermines the harm minimisation principles of the Act.
- Breaches the intent of the licence.

This also raises questions about the hospitality focus of the premises and whether it continues to meet the criteria for holding an on-licence.

Duty Manager Not on Site (Sections 131(1)(a) 105(1)(b) and 214(1))

A certified duty manager is legally required to always be on duty when alcohol is being sold or supplied. The absence of a duty manager:

- Indicates a serious failure of management and supervision.
- Raises concerns about the suitability of the licensee to comply with the Act.
- Increases the risk of sale to intoxicated persons or minors.



These breaches apply to both the on-licence and off-licence application due to the a lack of systems to ensure ongoing compliance.

Suitability of the Applicant (Section 105(1)(b))

The non-compliance, particularly with core obligations, reflects poorly on the applicant's suitability to hold a licence. These are not minor issues; they are systemic problems of the operation and responsible

alcohol management.

Considering the above, I respectfully request that the District Licensing Committee consider a truncated license for the renewal of both the on-licence and off-licence for Mackies Hotel until the licensee can demonstrate full compliance with the Act and a commitment to responsible alcohol management.
