EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This is a report for an application by St Kilda Tavern (2002) Limited for the renewal of on and offlicences for the premises situated at 2 Prince Albert Road, Dunedin, and known as the "St Kilda Tavern". The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to these applications.
- The applicant has not been involved with the running of the premises for the past two years. The business is for sale and has been operating with two prospective purchasers utilising temporary authorities. The applicant is seeking to renew the licences to allow a third entity to operate on a temporary authority while their own application is prepared and submitted.
- There have been issues with the previous two holders of temporary authorities for the premises. The Licensing Inspector stated that the application is missing a lot of detail and believes the Committee would benefit by hearing how the applicant intends to operate in the future. The suitability of the holder of the temporary authority is not a factor in this matter.
- 4 Public notice of the application did not attract any objection and the Medical Officer of Health Delegate did not opposed the application. No report was received from the Police.



APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

Applicant

- The applicant in this matter is the owner of the building and is seeking to renew the on and offlicences for the business operating from the premises. They do not live locally.
- In the past two years there have been two previous operators at the premises utilising temporary authorities while their own applications were determines. The first was opposed by the agencies and they withdrew their application before the matter was heard by the Committee.
- 7 The second operator's applications were also opposed. After a hearing before the Dunedin District Licensing Committee, the applications were declined.
- 8 A third person has indicated an interest in the premises and is operating on a temporary authority.
- The underlying licences for the premises expired on 14 April 2025 so, in order for the interested party to operate, the applicant seeks to renew the underlying on and off-licences.

PUBLIC NOTICE

- Public notice of the applications did not attract any objections. The Medical Officer of Health Delegate did not oppose the applications and the Police did not submit a report.
- 11 The Licensing Inspector has expressed concern that the application is not based on any current trading practice and the applicant is no longer actively involved with the business. The Inspector commented that it was unclear how the object of the Act could be upheld when the application was not based on any trade practice.
- The suitability of the applicant could not be assessed by the Inspector because they are no longer active in the business operated from the premises.
- The Inspector believes the Committee would benefit from hearing the matter so they may understand the nature of the business and how it is intended to be run in the future.

CONCLUSION

14 This hearing is an opportunity for the applicant to explain the purpose of the licence renewals, the future direction of the business, and to satisfy the Committee that the renewals are required.





St. Kilda Tavern - Mitigation Report

The tavern has been operating as licensed premises from the same building since 1875 and has thus come to be seen as a community neighbourhood tavern. The patronage is predominantly of a middle aged and upper clientele, mostly employed in the immediate and South Dunedin area and thus has created its own "target" market, if there were to be a "target" market at all. As such the nature of the clientele does not lend itself to negative behaviour such as loitering or vandalism. In the last twenty years of current management, there has been little if at all attention required from the licencing authorities or the police.

With regards to any near housing, any sound from the premises is generally contained within the premises due to wall thickness and as the premises supplies its own car park, neighbourhood car parking is not impinged upon. Opening hours are generally sociable in that, while currently licenced to operate to 2.00.a.m. on a Saturday night, service generally winds down from midnight. And in general, the aim is to close around 1.00.a.m of the Saturday night. Earlier on all other nights. As we wind down service from an hour before closing times, patrons are able to disperse over an extended period, thus not putting undue pressure on available transport operators, nor putting a large group of patrons on the street at one time. We also encourage and will arrange, as per our Host Responsibility, safe transport options.

There is amplified music on a Saturday night which ceases at mid-night and noise containment is again as the above plus that any outside doors to courtyards, etc. are kept closed after 11.00.p.m.

There are two churches on corners across from the premises, two separated by at least one corner building. The premises, having been established in 1875, pre-date the churches, one of which decided to establish itself across the road only in the last four years. The has never been any discourse from these church bodies.

The premises and management actively supports and upholds Host Responsibility as per our Licence Renewal Application. Also, the nature of the premises and clientele does not require active security measures other than staff vigilance, although on Saturday nights because of a larger patronage, a security person is present.

Advertising is minimal other than "naming" signage on the building and once weekly advertising in the newspaper as to Saturday night entertainment.

With regard to the tavern's Off Licence, a bottle shop or liquor store with separate premises or street front positioning with associated advertising is not involved. Rather sales are mostly limited to beer as a take out across the bar – spirits and wines are not stocked for Off Licence sales, such spirits and wines being stocked for on premise consumption. As such, compared to other off licence premises, the impact of this Off Licence in the local area is minimal.



ST KILDA TAVERN HOST RESPONSIBILITY POLICY

The management and staff of St Kilda Tavern believe that we have a responsibility

- •Patrons who are visibly intoxicated will not be served alcohol, they will be offered tea, coffee or water or will be asked to leave the premises and encouraged to take advantage of safe transport options.
- •We will promote transport options to get you safely home. Staff will ring you a taxi or friend to get you home at anytime.
- •We will encourage more people to have a designated driver. By offering free tea and coffee. As well as an interesting range of low-alcohol and alcohol free drinks.
- •We will make sure all these services are well promoted.
- •We will display signage required under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol/Act 2012.
- •We will maintain a training and management policy to give our staff the skills and support they need to do their job responsibly.
- •Please be our guest and take advantage of the services we offer.
- *Host responsibility makes sure that everyone has a good time, and leaves in a safe shape for the road home. It could save our licence, and it could save your life.





St. Kilda Tavern - Mitigation Report

The tavern has been operating as licensed premises from the same building since 1875 and has thus come to be seen as a community neighbourhood tavern. The patronage is predominantly of a middle aged and upper clientele, mostly employed in the immediate and South Dunedin area and thus has created its own "target" market, if there were to be a "target" market at all. As such the nature of the clientele does not lend itself to negative behaviour such as loitering or vandalism. In the last twenty years of current management, there has been little if at all attention required from the licencing authorities or the police.

With regards to any near housing, any sound from the premises is generally contained within the premises due to wall thickness and as the premises supplies its own car park, neighbourhood car parking is not impinged upon. Opening hours are generally sociable in that, while currently licenced to operate to 2.00.a.m. on a Saturday night, service generally winds down from midnight. And in general, the aim is to close around 1.00.a.m of the Saturday night. Earlier on all other nights. As we wind down service from an hour before closing times, patrons are able to disperse over an extended period, thus not putting undue pressure on available transport operators, nor putting a large group of patrons on the street at one time. We also encourage and will arrange, as per our Host Responsibility, safe transport options.

There is amplified music on a Saturday night which ceases at mid-night and noise containment is again as the above plus that any outside doors to courtyards, etc. are kept closed after 11.00.p.m.

There are two churches on corners across from the premises, two separated by at least one corner building. The premises, having been established in 1875, pre-date the churches, one of which decided to establish itself across the road only in the last four years. The has never been any discourse from these church bodies.

The premises and management actively supports and upholds Host Responsibility as per our Licence Renewal Application. Also, the nature of the premises and clientele does not require active security measures other than staff vigilance, although on Saturday nights because of a larger patronage, a security person is present.

Advertising is minimal other than "naming" signage on the building and once weekly advertising in the newspaper as to Saturday night entertainment.

With regard to the tavern's Off Licence, a bottle shop or liquor store with separate premises or street front positioning with associated advertising is not involved. Rather sales are mostly limited to beer as a take out across the bar – spirits and wines are not stocked for Off Licence sales, such spirits and wines being stocked for on premise consumption. As such, compared to other off licence premises, the impact of this Off Licence in the local area is minimal.

Inspector's comment

This report is prepared for the District Licensing Committee's consideration.

These base licence renewal applications for both the ON and OFF licences at St Kilda Tavern, are technical renewals only to enable new owners to hold Temporary Authority licences. Since this applicant, Mr Tolerton, last ran this business, two previous new owners have attempted to obtain full alcohol licences, however, both have been unsuccessful. Currently, the third new owner is operating the tavern on yet another set of temporary licences.

The suitability of the new owner is not considered within these base licence renewal applications. However, I question the need to allow these technical licence renewals to be granted when the applicant is not trading nor actively involved in this business in any way and hasn't been for some time. Any possible financial or other gain from renewing these base licences for the applicant, is not a matter of concern for the committee, nor the reporting agencies.

As such, the applications do not reflect current trading activities, for example no duty managers have been stated, the applicant's answers to questions around food availability and the management of the premises, including the host responsibility policy provided, are not current policies nor accurate information given the applicant isn't running the actual business nor based in Dunedin anymore.

It is unclear how the object and purpose of the Act can be upheld, when these applications are paper based only and not based upon actual intended trading activities, by an applicant present in and attempting to operate this business.

I believe the committee would benefit from hearing from the applicant directly to try understand and identify the intended operation and future direction of this business. For these reasons, I oppose the application.

I request the committee hear this matter as soon as possible, given the current temporary licences associated with these base licence renewals.
