EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This is a report for an application by Jethro Holdings Limited for the renewal of an off-licence for their premises situated at 185 Kaikorai Valley Road, Dunedin, and known as "Bottle O Kaikorai Valley". The criteria found at section 131 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- 2 The applicant does not seek any changes to the licence.
- Public notice of the application did not attract any public objections but the three reporting agencies, Licensing Inspector, Police, and Medical Officer of Health Delegate have all opposed the application.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

Applicant

When the renewal application was received, the applicant company had equal directors and shareholders, Mrs P McCarthy and Mr K McCarthy.

- On 7 August 2025 the directorship of the company was changed with both Mr and Mrs McCarthy being removed and replaced by Ms C McCarthy. Mr and Mrs McCarthy are still the shareholders for the company.
- 6 Mr and Mrs McCarthy were the directors and shareholders of two other companies, MJ Enterprises Limited and McCarthy Enterprises Limited, which had renewals for two other off-licence premises declined because they failed to demonstrate they were suitable to hold alcohol licences.
- 7 Jethro Holdings Limited has held the licence for Bottle O Kaikorai Valley since 2013.

PUBLIC NOTICE

- 8 Public notice of the application did not attract any objection.
- 9 The Police, Medical Officer of Health Delegate, and Chief Licensing Inspector all opposed the renewal of the licence.

Objections

- 10 The Medical Officer of Health has opposed the licence renewal for the following reasons:
 - a) The current closing time of 10.00 pm increases the potential for excessive alcohol consumption and associated alcohol-related harms, for example road crashes and alcohol-related injuries. It is suggested that a reduction in licence hours will see a reduction in alcohol-related harm.
 - b) The suitability of the Applicant is in doubt. Wanting to retain the 10.00 pm closing time is inconsistent with the object of the Act which is that the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol is undertaken safely and responsibly and that the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol is minimised.
- 11 The Police have opposed the application for the following reasons:
 - a) Suitability of the Applicant: the Applicant has had two off-licence application declined at hearings. They also state that the Applicant had recently appeared in the District Court for selling to a minor in a controlled purchase operation.
 - b) Hours of operation: the Police state that the current hours, 9.00 am to 10.00 pm, are excessive and believe more appropriate hours would see a 9.00 pm closing time.
 - c) Amenity and good order of the locality: the Police believe the amenity and good order of the locality would increase if the licence is not renewed.
 - d) Police would request, if the renewal is granted, conditions preventing external advertising or promotion of alcohol on the premises and that there is no single sales of RTDs, shots, beer, or cider in containers 500ml or less for under \$6.00 per unit.
- 12 The Chief Licensing Inspector has opposed the application for the following reasons:
 - a) McCarthy Enterprises Limited had their renewal application for Bottle O Mosgiel declined in May 2024. The directors of the company, Mr and Mrs McCarthy, were directors of MJ Enterprises Limited which had the renewal application for Quicker Liquor declined in July 2023. Both licences were declined because of suitability issues.



- b) There were missing documents in the current application for Bottle O Kaikorai Valley. They have applied for licence renewals in the past but the attitude of the Applicant remains unchanged. The Inspector is not confident the Applicant will undertake the sale and supply of alcohol responsibly.
- There was a suggestion that Mr and Mrs McCarthy would be removed as directors and shareholders of the company. At the time of writing the opposition report, no changes had been made. A change is directors has since been notified but Mr and Mrs McCarthy are still the sole shareholders of the business.

CONCLUSION

- 14 This application for the renewal of an off-licence has been opposed by the three reporting agencies because the Applicant's directors and shareholders, but with different company entities, have previously had licence renewals declined because of suitability issues.
- 15 There has now been a change in the directors for the applicant company but the shareholding has remained the same.
- This hearing is an opportunity for the Applicant to satisfy the Committee the change in directors for the company will make a difference and that they now have the processes and systems in place to ensure the sale and supply of alcohol id undertaken properly.



Mr and Mrs McCarthy are also current directors/shareholders of the following companies: MJ Enterprises Limited, Five Roads Alpacas Limited, and McCarthy Enterprises Limited.

Bottle O is part of a chain of bottle stores throughout New Zealand. Previously, the applicant's store was under the Super Liquor franchise, however this changed to Bottle O late 2023.

Inspector's comment

This report is prepared for the District Licensing Committee's consideration.

The applicant is known to both the committee and the authority, having appeared before both in recent years. Most recently the applicant appeared for McCarthy Enterprises Limited, for Mosgiel Bottle O, which was an application declined by the committee (Decision released 31 May 2024)



with a trade-out period granted. The applicant has also appeared representing MJ Enterprises (Trading as Quicker Liquor), which was an application declined by the committee (Decision released 5 July 2023) due to the licensee being found unsuitable to hold an alcohol licence. The director and shareholders of MJ Enterprises are the same Directors/Shareholders of McCarthy Enterprises Limited and are the same director/shareholders again before the committee with this renewal application under Jethro Holdings Limited.

The previous failings of the applicant are in relation to not having appropriate staff, systems, and training in place as per section 105 (j) of the Act. This is again evidenced within this application with no host responsibility policy being provided within the application, as a basic requirement clearly outlined on the application front page checklist for all applications.

This calls into question the overall suitability of the applicant under section 105 (b), with similar concerns raised by the other agencies who I support under section 105 (k) of the Act.

The object of the Act therefore is also called into question regarding the applicant ensuring the sale and supply of alcohol is undertaken responsibility when there is an overall lack of organisation and awareness displayed by the applicant.

The agencies have met with and exchanged communications with the applicant and associated family members throughout April to July. The premises has been for sale; however, no potential buyers have been confirmed as of the date of this report.

Communications I have received have led me to believe the company structure of the applicant may be changing, with Patricia and Kenneth McCarthy potentially both being removed as director/shareholders. However, as of the date of this report, no changes have been observed on the NZ Companies register, nor has any confirmation been received of any changes being made, which may prompt a re-assessment of applicant suitability by the agencies.

For the above reasons I oppose the renewal of this application and believe the application should fail

Opposition to Renewal of Off-Licence for Bottle O Kaikorai Valley

Introduction:

This submission is presented in **opposition** to the renewal application submitted by Jethro Holding Limited trading as Bottle O Kaikorai Valley, which seeks to maintain its current trading hours, closing at 10pm. The Medical Officer of Health requests a reduction in trading hours from 10pm to 9pm. We support this request for a reduction, as we believe it aligns with the objectives of the *Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012* (the Act) and is necessary to reduce alcohol-related harm in the community.

Relevant Provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (NZ):

The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 provides a legal framework that aims to reduce alcoholrelated harm, ensure the responsible sale and consumption of alcohol, and promote public health and safety. The following provisions of the Act are particularly relevant:

- 1. Section 4 Purpose of the Act: The purpose of the Act is to:
 - Ensure that the sale, supply, and consumption of alcohol are undertaken safely and responsibly.
 - Prevent the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol.
- 2. **Section 5 Objectives:** When determining alcohol licence conditions, the Act requires that the licensing authority consider:
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ The harm caused by alcohol consumption, including crime, injury, and health problems.
 - $_{\odot}$ Ensuring that alcohol is sold and consumed in a manner that minimizes the risk of harm to the community.
- 3. **Section 105 Licensing Objectives:** The licensing authority is required to determine whether a licence should be granted, renewed, or amended, taking into account factors such as:
 - o The object of the Act to minimize alcohol-related harm.
 - o The suitability of the applicant and the premises.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ The level of alcohol-related harm in the locality and the potential for further harm.



Grounds for Opposition:

Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora

- 1. Increased Alcohol-Related Harm with Extended Trading Hours: The extension of trading hours until 10pm increases the potential for excessive alcohol consumption, particularly later in the evening. Studies have found that reducing the availability of alcohol late at night for off-licences is associated with lower consumption levels, reductions in hospital admissions for alcohol intoxication, especially for young people, and reductions in road crashes and alcohol-related injuries.¹
- 2. A reduction in trading hours, as requested by the Medical Officer of Health, from 10pm to 9pm, would reduce the availability of alcohol late at night and is consistent with the Act's objectives to minimize alcohol-related harm. By closing earlier, Leith Liquor would limit opportunities for alcohol consumption that contribute to higher risks of harm, thereby promoting a safer environment for the community.

The Medical Officer of Health's request to reduce trading hours aligns with the harm-reduction principles outlined in the Act. By restricting the availability of alcohol, the risk of harm—such as alcohol-fuelled violence and emergency department admissions—would be reduced.

3. **Suitability of the Premises and Applicant:** Under Section 105 of the *Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*, licensing authorities must consider the suitability of the applicant and the premises, as well as the level of alcohol-related harm in the locality. The applicant's request to maintain trading hours until 10pm is inconsistent with the goals of the Act, particularly when the community is already experiencing significant harm related to alcohol consumption.

Reducing the trading hours to 9pm would be more suitable for the community, especially considering the negative impact of late-night alcohol availability on public health and safety. The applicant has a responsibility to ensure the premises operate in a way that minimizes harm and supports responsible alcohol consumption.



Conclusion:

Granting Bottle O Kaikorai Valley's request to maintain trading hours until 10pm would be inconsistent with the *Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*, particularly in relation to the Act's focus on minimizing alcohol-related harm. We respectfully request that the licensing authority impose a reduction of trading hours to 9pm, as this would better align with the harm-reduction principles of the Act and contribute to ensuring the responsible sale and consumption of alcohol in our community.

On 25/02/2025 Police received an application from Jethro Holdings Limited for the renewal of the Off-Licence for the premises known as Bottle O Kaikorai Valley.

This is a busy suburban premises situated on Kaikorai Valley Road, Bradford, Dunedin. The premises is one of three off licence premises within a 1km radius.

The market for this premises is predominantly the residential community that resides nearby. Being positioned along a main arterial route towards and away from Dunedin City it is also attractive to customers travelling along these routes.

Police oppose the renewal of this licence under Section 131:

- (a) The matters set out in paragraphs (a) to (g), and (k) of section 105(1)
- (b) Whether (in it's opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence

Specifically, s.105(1)

- (a) The Object of the Act
- (b) The suitability of the applicant
- (d) The days on which the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol

Object of the Act

- (1) The object of this Act is that-
 - (a) The sale, supply and consumption of alcohol should be undertaken safely and responsibly; and
 - (b) The harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimized.
- (2) for the purposes of subsection (1), the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol includes-

(a) any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness or injury, directly or indirectly caused or directly or indirectly contributed to, by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol; and (b) any harm to society generally or the community, directly or indirectly caused or directly or indirectly contributed to, by any crime, damage, death, disease, disorderly behavior, illness or injury of a kind described in paragraph (a)

Police will submit the Object of the Act can not be met with this application due to the suitability of the applicant and the operation of their other premises. The amenity and good order of the area is already so badly affected by alcohol related harm from excessive and inappropriate consumption.

Suitability of the Applicant

The applicant holds a number of other licenced premises in Dunedin City and are listed below:

- Bottle O Andersons Bay
- Bottle O Cumberland

The applicant's previous premises were:

- Bottle O Mosgiel
- Quicker Liquor

Police submit that the applicant has been twice declined an application for their previous premises by the Dunedin DLC. Furthermore, they have recently been subject to a Police Prosecution before the Dunedin District Court for a charge of Unlicensed Person Sells Alcohol as well as previously failing Controlled Purchase Operations. Thus, Police submit the applicant is not suitable to hold a licence.

In discussing the meaning of "suitability", Holland J said in Re Sheard [1996] 1 NZLR 751, [1996] NZAR 61 (HC) at 755:

"Suitability is a word commonly used in the English language and is well understood. In an earlier decision the Authority has adopted the definition in The Concise Oxford dictionary as 'well fitted for the purpose, appropriate'. I do not find it helpful to refer to other decisions on different facts as to the meaning of that word. Where a statute uses an unambiguous and well understood word or expression and chooses not to enlarge on the ordinary definition of the word or expression by a special interpretation in the statute it is usually unwise for a Court to add to the ordinary meaning of the word as a general guide for all cases, as distinct from applying the word to the particular facts before it."

The Authority stated, in Re Jays LLA 994/94, 15 July 1994, that: "Differing aspects of suitability will be given different weight by decisionmakers under the Act. Among them are experience in the hospitality industry, management ability, and personal integrity."

In Two Brothers Wholesale Ltd (2021) NZARLA 32:

"[103] it is not correct that suitability must only be considered in the context of the operation of licensed premises as regards the safe and responsible sale and supply and consumption of alcohol. As is clear from Nishchay's an assessment of suitability is much wider and includes considerations of the

character and reputation of the applicant and its honesty as well as considerations of the operation of premises. Whether or not the grant of the licence will result in the reduction or an increase in liquor abuse is a relevant issue as are considerations about how a licensee will deal with liquor abuse issues that may arise from the establishment of the business, but suitability is not restricted to these matters."

Amenity and good order

Police records of alcohol related incidents in the area indicate high calls for Police service in Dunedin City where alcohol is a contributing factor. The premises is classed under the NZ Census 2023 Deprivation Index as being located in an area with a deprivation score of 8. This is defined as a high deprivation area. Police will submit there is a direct link between the deprivation of an area and alcohol related harm.

Police will submit there is no requirement for a 'causative link' between the premises and harm occurring in the area as Clark J commented in the Lion Liquor Retail Limited High Court decision NZHC 1123 [2018] [68] In the face of such evidence the Act does not countenance the continuation of high levels of alcohol-related harm. The Act requires minimisation of the alcohol-related harm. The task of the DLC was to respond to the risk and it did so. It is not necessary to establish, as the Authority required, that the proposed operation "would be likely to lead to" alcohol-related harm. To require demonstration of a link to this degree of specificity is not much different from requiring proof. Requiring proof of "a causative link is not only unrealistic but is contrary to the correct legal position".

The days on which the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol

The applicant is currently requesting the following trading hours:

Monday to Sunday 9am to 10pm

Police will submit it is inappropriate for this premises to be open for the amount of time considering the area in which it is located and the harm occurring as a result. Police will provide evidence that supports maximum trading hours for the premises of:

Monday to Sunday 9am to 9pm

Conditions Sought

The sale of single serve, high octane alcohol at a cheap price does not align with the object of the act in that the vulnerable community in which this premises is situated are exposed to higher levels of harm. Furthermore, the advertising of alcohol on the external surrounds of the premises is exposing an already vulnerable community to further harm, particularly minors.

If the committee were of a mind to renew the licence, Police would seek the following licence conditions:

- 1) No external Alcohol advertising or promotion on the building premises
- No single sales of RTD's, shots, or beer or cider 500ml or less for under \$6
