## DISCUSSION

### Role and Purpose of Te Pae Māori

- 7 Te Pae Māori provides strategic oversight and advice to support informed Council decision-making in relation to Māori outcomes. Its role includes consideration of forward-looking priorities, alignment of strategy and delivery, and providing clear advice to Council and the Chief Executive.
- 8 This includes:
  - a) **Strategic Context & Foresight**
    - Awareness of upcoming Council decisions, including Long-Term Plan, Annual Plan and key strategies.
    - Identification of risks, issues, and opportunities likely to impact mana whenua and Māori communities.
    - Consideration of national and regional policy developments and their implications.
  - b) **Māori Strategic Framework – Progress and Alignment**
    - Monitoring progress against the Māori Strategic Framework
    - Identification of emerging issues, risks, and opportunities relevant to Māori communities.
    - Consideration of national and regional policy developments and their implications.
  - c) **Advice to Council and Chief Executive**
    - Providing clear and actionable recommendations.
    - Identifying matters that require escalation.
    - Informing upcoming Council decisions, planning, and investment priorities.

### Strategic Context and Current Activity

- 9 Key strategic areas currently within scope include:
  - Annual Plan 2026-2027
  - Long-Term Plan 2027-2037
  - Levels of Service
  - Aukaha Work Programme
- 10 Mana Ruruku contributes to a range of Council work, including policies, plans, bylaws, submissions, and cross-team advisory support.



### Mana Ruruku Activity

- 23 Mana Ruruku has contributed to a range of cross Council initiatives between October 2025 and March 2026 including policy development, submissions, and advisory work. This work is detailed in Attachment A.
- 24 This work supports Council decision-making by providing input on potential impacts, alignment with strategic priorities, and opportunities for improved engagement.
- 25 The following items are scheduled for consideration at upcoming Te Pae Māori hui:
- a) Naming Policy
  - b) Te Reo Māori Policy
  - c) Review of Koha Policy and Guidelines
  - d) Review of relationship frameworks
  - e) Updates to Māori impact assessment processes.
- 26 These items will support ongoing alignment between strategic intent, policy development and operational delivery.

### OPTIONS

- 27 As this report is for noting there are no options or summary of considerations.

### NEXT STEPS

- 28 Mana Ruruku will work with Aukaha to develop an engagement process to identify mana whenua priorities and inform a collaborative work programme for the next financial year.
