EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This is a report for an application for a new off-licence. The criteria found at section 105 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- The applicant has owned the premises for the last 12 years and, up to 2017, held both on and off-licences. In 2017 they restructured the licensee company which required a new licence. At that time, they opted not to seek an off-licence.
- In the past three years they have found there is demand for an off-licence, mainly for the sale of wine to the tourists off cruise ships, but also to the residents in the area.
- The application was advertised with no objections being received. However, the Police and Medical Officer of Health have both opposed the grant of this licence.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

Applicant

The applicant has owned and operated the historic premises for 12 years. Accommodation is no longer available, so it operates as a tavern. In 2017 they restructured and renamed the



company and applied for a new on-licence under the new entity. At the time they decided not to seek a new off-licence.

- The premises is a popular destination for people from the cruise ships that stop in Port Chalmers. They are often asked to sell bottles of wine to the passengers so decided to apply for a new off-licence. The local drinkers also inquire about off-licence sales.
- There are no suitability issues with the applicant and the premises is well managed. There is a well-defined bar area as well as both public and private dining areas on the ground floor. A courtyard is also available to be used by patrons.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The public notice did not attract any objections. However, the Police and Medical Officer of Health have both opposed the grant of this licence.

Objections

- 9 Police: The Police opposition makes the following points:
 - a) There is no problem with the premises. It is well managed.
 - b) The application indicates the premises is now operating as a restaurant with the majority of its income derived from food. The principal business of the premises is the sale of food.
 - c) It does not appear to be either a tavern or hotel therefore does not meet the requirements of s.32(1) of the Act.
- Medical Officer of Health: This opposition is the same as that of the Police but they also make the following points:
 - a) The applicant self-identified the principal purpose of the premises is a restaurant.
 - b) The application states that the sale of alcohol has become a compliment rather than the focus of the business.
- Licensing Inspector: While the Inspector does not make a recommendation in their report the following points are made:
 - a) There are no suitability issues with the applicant nor does the application go against the object of the Act.
 - b) The applicant states the alcohol sales make up 35 40% of their turnover. The applicant does not meet the requirements of s.32 of the Act.
 - c) Prior to 2017, at the renewal of their previous off-licence, eligibility of the company to have an off-licence was never considered. The premises looked and operated like a tavern therefore this was never considered.

DISCUSSION

- Once advised of the agency opposition, the applicant sent a letter explaining the business. Points made in the letter include:
 - a) The bar is an integral part of the business and caters for the regular drinkers, including 200 Social Club members. These people are present all year round.



- b) There is a strong seasonal component to the business. The summer is dominated by cruise ship passengers and independent travellers. In winter it is the local community. At any time, there will be locals sitting at the bar socialising.
- c) With the Covid-19 pandemic, cruise ships will not be coming to Port Chalmers in the foreseeable future therefore alcohol sales will return to be the main income. The offlicence will help the continuation of the business.

CONCLUSION AND CONDITIONS

- Section 32(1) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 states that an off-licence can be issued to the holder of an on-licence issued for a hotel or tavern, for the premises (or part of the premises) for which the on-licence is held.
- The premises is no longer a hotel but has operated as a tavern under the current ownership. A tavern is defined as premises used or intended to be used in the course of business principally for providing alcohol and other refreshments to the public.
- 15 The premises used to have an off-licence up until a company restructure in 2017 at which time they decided against seeking such a licence. Until this time the style of business was not considered at renewal times because the premises looked like and operated as a tavern.
- While the applicant stated the principal business is a restaurant, the applicant subsequently wrote that the premises' business is seasonal with the summer being frequented by tourists, in particular cruise ship passengers, who enjoy their premises for lunches. In the winter their main customers are the locals who meet to socialise over a drink.
- 17 The matter is to be determined at a hearing at which the parties can speak to their points of view.





Community Risk Mitigation Report

To whom it may concern,

Carey's Bay Hotel has been trading for over 145 years and is a treasured integral component of the Carey's Bay and wider Port Chalmers and Dunedin communities. We are operating in a residential area as a blend of restaurant/bar/café and function venue. There are no churches, schools, early childhood facilities, or the like within an approximate 2km radius.

The hotel as a business is complex. It four current components of our operation meld into one seamless operation. We are very community focused and most of our staff lives in the Port Chalmers area.

One component of the hotel operates as a "public house". We have generation upon generation of people who name the hotel as their "local". In this sense we can be likened to an old English style pub where everyone knows everyone else, they keep an eye on each other and treat the hotel like an extension of their living room. The feeling is very social and friendly, and we have many local families, parents, grandparents and children who all feel comfortable and happy in a social non-threatening environment that is not solely focused on the serving of alcohol.

We maintain a café style component to the business; available at any time of the day, we serve and promote good coffee, herbal teas, organic juices and an extensive bar menu well as the obligatory cakes, desserts and cheese rolls. Water is always freely available at a water station and placed on tables.

We operate a popular and busy seafood restaurant as a major part of the business. We are very "food focused", the restaurant menu is served seven days a week for lunch and dinner and it is very busy as a destination restaurant for locals and visitors.

The fourth component to our business is as a function venue. We host weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, Christmas parties, Murder Mystery nights, fund-raising dinners, corporate dinners, business meetings, music & comedy evenings and many local events.

We are primarily food focused with all our events, we have a strict policy regarding the provision of food for parties, and we turn down bookings if we consider they aren't providing enough food for their guests.



We occasionally host touring bands but maintain an acoustic only policy and anyone playing has to be finished by 11pm to minimise any annoyance to neighbours. Our closing time now, even on Friday and Saturday nights is mostly pre-midnight and our local police in conversation have stated they are very happy with the way the hotel is managed.

We have maintained a zero-tolerance attitude to the "rugby boy" mentality that prevailed when we took the business over from the previous owners and have stamped out the negative drinking behaviour that went along with this. I am happy to say we have had many years now of running a trouble-free environment.

Our target market within the business is varied but once again all our marketing is food focused. We never "special" or promote alcohol and have no posters or extra branding in the establishment. We take pride in promoting our restaurant and have also extended our marketing to promote our traditional high teas, which have become another important part of the business. Our liquor license, while important to us has become a compliment rather than a focus of the business. Our alcohol sales consistently sit at 35-40% of our total sales.

Our location is in a residential area and we have close relationships with the neighbours who know they can talk to us about any problems they may have. They are mostly all patrons of the bar and restaurant and we have had very few issues in the 12 years we have been operating.

We have an open honest relationship with our regular patrons and ensure their safety at all times. We operate a courtesy van that many utilize to get home safely and Friday night pickups and drop-offs have become a regular addition to their end of week social calendar.

We operate our business with pride and social responsibility and intend to keep doing so for many years yet.

We would like to apply for our off-license as an add-on to our business, we now have an interesting supply of craft beers on tap and customers are keen to take these away. As a note we choose craft beers in the 2%-6.5% range and deliberately don't choose beers above this percentage. We would also be selling wine as customers are interested in the range we stock. We aren't planning on stocking pack beer or extra bottles of spirits for sale.

Police have enquired into this application for an off-licence. The applicant is well known to police and there have been no issues associated with the premises, it is a well-run and managed establishment.

The only matter that must be raised is the style of premises that this business has become. The premises appears not to be a tavern or a hotel as required under section 32 (1), as the business has morphed into one where the majority of income is derived from the restaurant.

Tavern is defined under the Act as "a premises used or intended to be used in the course of business principally for providing alcohol and other refreshments to the public."

Restaurant is defined in the Act as "premises that are used or intended to be used in the course of business principally for supplying meals to the public for eating on the premises."

The principal business of the premises is providing meals not alcohol, and as such police object to the application.

I refer to the application received on 20 April 2020, from Golden Harvest Contractors Limited, for a new Off Licence for the premises situated at 17 Macandrew Rd, Careys Bay, Dunedin

I have considered this application with respect to the public health issues involved. This report advises that the application is opposed and the grounds for our opposition are as follows

Ref Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 Section 32 Kinds of premises for which off-licences may be issued

This section specifies that the following kinds of premises are able to be granted an off licence (paraphrased):

- A hotel or tavern where an on-licence is issued for the premises
- A bottle store (retail premises where 85% of the revenue is expected to be from the sale of alcohol)
- Remote seller (where 85% of the revenue is expected to be from the remote sale of alcohol)
- An alcohol manufacturer
- A supermarket
- A grocery store

The Act defines a tavern as meaning a "premises used or intended to be used in the course of business principally for providing alcohol and other refreshments to the public"

In the application the applicant has self-identified the principal purpose of their business as that of a restaurant:

- In answer to "Is the sale of alcohol intended to be the principal purpose of the business?" they have ticked "no"
- In answer to "If no, specify what is the principal purpose of the business?" they have written 'Restaurant"
- Further on in the application they have also made the following statements:
 - "we operate a popular and busy seafood restaurant as a major part of the business"
 - "Our liquor licence, while important to us has become a compliment rather than a focus of the

An off-licence cannot be issued under Section 32 as the premises is principally a restaurant.

I oppose the issue of this licence.

This report is prepared for the District Licensing Committee's consideration.

The application is made under section 32 1(a) "to the holder of an on-licence issued for a hotel or tavern, for the premises (or part of the premises) for which the on-licence is held".

The Act defines a tavern as "means premises used or intended to be used in the course of business principally for providing alcohol and other refreshments to the public".

Within the applicant's supporting information confines the comment

Our target market within the business is varied but once again all our marketing is food focused. We never "special" or promote alcohol and have no posters or extra branding in the establishment. We take pride in promoting our restaurant and have also extended our marketing to promote our traditional high teas, which have become another important part of the business. Our liquor license, while important to us has become a compliment rather than a focus of the business. Our alcohol sales consistently sit at 35-40% of our total sales.

If alcohol sales are "35 to 40% of our total sales" then the business does not satisfy the definition of a tavern and consequently does satisfy the section 32 requirement.

This does seem an unfair situation in that the success of the other components of the business after 12 years of management would now make the premises ineligible.

Prior to the applicant deciding the let the licence expire in 2017, there was no consideration that the premises was ineligible. The premises has always had the appearance of a tavern and was treated accordingly.

Hi Ian and Toni,

I have been speaking to Tony Mole regarding our off-license application.

Tony has notified me that our application has been opposed by the medical officer of health and the police on the technicality that our business revenue is made up of more food sales than drinks sales.

I would like to reply to this opposition now rather than wait to be officially contacted.

I feel to explain our business further is necessary. I am going to raise some points in these email which I feel are important to your decision.

- 1. Our bar is an integral part of our business. We have a large group of regular local social drinkers, (including 200 members in our social club). On any given night you could expect to come in and find both Port locals and visitors sitting at our bar leaners enjoying a drink and good company. To all these customers we are known as Careys Bay Pub not Careys Bay restaurant.
- 2. Through our quiet winter season these customers are the mainstay of our business.
- 3. We have a strong seasonal aspect to our business. Our summer season doubles the amount of business we do in the winter.

Our summer business has grown to be dominated by Cruise ship restaurant customers, Cruise ship food tours, Taiwanese and Chinese bus food tours, large numbers of independent overseas travellers, a couple of months of large work Xmas functions and the odd small wedding. The pub/local drinkers continue throughout.

Needless to say we now expect most, if not all of this business to disappear under Covid-19 leaving us with our pub trade and a much smaller restaurant trade.

The loss from all this summer business means we will miss out on <a href="https://memory.org/hundreds.org/hun

- 4. I would contend that without this trade for the foreseeable future, if not for the next few years we could easily return to our drinks sales being worth more than our food sales.
- 5. Finding new streams of revenue is crucial to our survival as a business doing a very decent job of holding an on-license

Having our off-license would help us continue to exist in what is a completely new, strange and unstable situation.

To end, I would emphasise that all projections for this current and very changed environment will mean the Careys Bay Hotel will return to be predominantly and technically a tavern in all respects.

Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, section 32

32 Kinds of premises for which off-licences may be issued

- (1) An off-licence may be issued only—
 - (a) to the holder of an on-licence issued for a hotel or tavern, for the premises (or part of the premises) for which the on-licence is held; or
 - (b) for retail premises where (in the opinion of the licensing authority or licensing committee concerned) at least 85% of the annual sales revenue is expected to be earned from the sale of alcohol for consumption somewhere else; or
 - (c) if-
 - (i) the premises for which it is to be issued are not retail premises; and
 - (ii) at least 85% of the annual income of the person to whom it is to be issued is (in the opinion of the licensing authority or licensing committee concerned) expected to be earned from the remote sale of alcohol; or
 - (d) for premises where (in the opinion of the licensing authority or licensing committee concerned) the principal business carried on is the manufacture of alcohol; or
 - (e) for premises that (in the opinion of the licensing authority or licensing committee concerned) are a supermarket with a floor area of at least 1 000 m² (including any separate departments set aside for such foodstuffs as fresh meat, fresh fruit and vegetables, and delicatessen items); or
 - (f) for premises that (in the opinion of the licensing authority or licensing committee concerned) are a grocery store.
- (2) Premises for which (by virtue of section 350(b)(i)) an off-licence must not be issued except to a licensing trust can still be premises for which (by virtue of subsection (1)) an off-licence may be issued.
- (3) Section 36 overrides subsection (1).
