EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- This is a report for an application for a new off-licence. The criteria found at section 105 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act) apply to this application.
- The applicant is seeking the off-licence for a premises that has held an on-licence for over 20 years, but this will be the first time an off-licence has been sought in the last 10 years.
- There have been no public objections made however the Police and Medical officer of Health have opposed the grant of this licence.

APPLICANT AND APPLICATION

Applicant

- The applicant has held an on-licence for the premises since 2018 and trades as "Equinox Restaurant and Bar". In the time the applicant has had the premises there have been no matters of concern. The applicant has another premises in Dunedin and this also operates without issues.
- The applicant is seeking an off-licence to sell alcohol Monday to Sunday between 9am and 10pm. The activity is covered by an existing Land Use Consent.



- The premises is below one of the stands belonging to the Forbury Park Trotting Club. The area owned by the Club is approximately 12 ha with the buildings near one corner. There is an early childhood service on one boundary, but it is approximately 267m from the entrance of this premises.
- 7 It is proposed that sales take place over the bar but there will be an open area where alcohol will be displayed.

OBJECTIONS

There were no objections received after public notice of the application. However, both the Police and Medical Officer of Health have opposed the grant of the licence.

Police

The Police have no suitability concerns regarding the applicant. However, they do have concerns about the layout of the proposed off-licence area which is situated within the current onlicensed area. There will be shelving forming an alcove adjacent to the bar which raises concerns about the security of stock on a busy night.

Medical Officer of Health

- 10 The Medical Officer of Health (MoH) has raised several areas of concern.
 - The Act refers to the principle business of a premises and, while "Wobblys Sports Bar" has the appearance of a tavern, "Equinox" does not. The applicant advised that 60-65% of his existing business is from the sale of food which would mean the principle business is not that of a tavern.
 - The population living in this area is at a higher risk of experiencing alcohol-related harm due to factors such as area deprivation.
 - The design and layout will mean patrons will select alcohol off the shelves to take to the bar for purchase.
 - The premises is within 1km of four schools and four early childhood services, including one which has a common boundary.
 - The Local Alcohol Policy states that "new hotels, taverns or bottle stores will not generally be granted for premises that is near to or adjacent to any 'sensitive facility'" and to "avoid misinterpretation, 'near to or adjacent to' will be defined as being within 100m of the nearest boundary to the sensitive facility." An early childhood service is a 'sensitive facility'.

CONCLUSION

- 11 The Police and MoH have opposed the grant of the licence pursuant to:
 - s.32 the kinds of premises that can be granted an off-licence
 - s.105(1)(a) the object of the Act
 - s.105(1)(e) design and layout of the premises



- s.106(1)(b)(i) the purposes for which land near the premises is used.
- 12 The Committee will first need to consider whether the premises can be granted a licence before considering the location of and layout of the premises.





No issues. Mr Cherian has a long history in hospitality with Little India, Black Dog and more recently with Equinox/Wobbly's with no problems

While there is no restriction on the location of licensed premises other than defined in the Dunedin District Plan, licences for new hotels, taverns or bottle stores will not generally be granted for a premises that is near to or adjacent to any 'sensitive facility', such as schools and playgrounds (see the glossary for the full definition). The police have commented

There is no question of the applicant's suitability, or the systems and training of the premises. The only area of concern for police is the intended layout of the off-licence, which is situated within the current on-licence. Normally such a off-licence is conducted by way of over the bar sales, whereby the stock is placed behind the bar and the purchase is handed over the bar. In the case of this application the stock will be displayed in shelving situated adjacent to the bar, forming a standalone alcove. Such a layout raises questions regarding security of the stock on a busy night.

Another unintended consequence of this layout means the patron carries the intended purchase across the from the shelves to the bar.

As such police oppose this application under section 105 (e), the design and layout of the proposed premises.

Inspector's comment

This report is prepared for the District Licensing Committee's consideration.

There are no issues as to the suitability of the applicant.

The premises has previously not held an off licence with the applicant seeking to add another revenue stream to the business.

The applicant has no intent to sign up to a franchise and to remain as an independent retailer.

The layout suggested by the applicant is confused and is not one currently operated by any other premises

The admission by the applicant that the restaurant side of the business means food sales are higher than the alcohol sales suggests that the application may fail at the first hurdle.

I do not oppose the issue of the licence but the issues relating to how the process of displaying and selling alcohol will occur and whether the premises is foremost a tavern need to be resolved.

Ultimately, the committee should hear the application and gain first hand information that will assist in the decision-making process.


